- 3** The number of directors of national nuclear labs who support the treaty.
- 5** The number of US Secretaries of Defense who have endorsed the treaty.
- 6** The number of months the Senate has spent in deliberations on the treaty.
- 7** The number of former commanders of US Strategic Command who support the treaty. The current commander supports it, too.
- 9** The number of US Secretaries of State who have endorsed the treaty.
- 14** The number of Senate Foreign Relations Committee members who voted for the resolution of the treaty out of committee with bipartisan support.
- 15** The number of years US inspectors have previously spent in Russia inspecting its nuclear weapons.
- 20** The total number of hearings held on the treaty in the Senate between the Foreign Relations Committee, Armed Services Committee and the Select Committee on Intelligence.
- 100** The percentage of the Joint Chiefs of Staff who support the treaty.
- 111<sup>th</sup>** The Congress in which the treaty has been carefully deliberated, and in which the treaty should be ratified.
- 368<sup>(and counting)</sup>** The number of days that have passed since US inspectors have been inside Russian nuclear facilities.

**4** The number of weeks left until the end of the year.

**0** The number of legitimate reasons to delay New START any further.
